



The new Cadillac Fleetwood Sixty Special Sedan is typical of the magnificent new Cadillac styling for 1957. It achieves a rare beauty that will make it a treasured masterpiece for years to come. Completely new in styling, it is a superlative blend of classic symmetry and functional design. The Sixty Special is almost three inches lower in over-all height, providing a more graceful silhouette and greater highway stability. The entire grille ensemble presents, for the first time, an important safety innovation—molded rubber bumper guard inserts. The smart, new rear fenders are enhanced by fender fairings that taper gracefully into dual taillight and directional signal light assemblies. Further accent on lowness is obtained by a brushed stainless-steel rear fender panel that carries forward to the rear door stone shield. This is the Cadillac Fleetwood Sixty Special for 1957—beautiful, luxurious and distinctive as never before.






Seen here is the 1957 edition of the famous Cadillac Sixty-Two Convertible—






The dynamic Cadillac engine for 1957 provides power, eagerness and responsiveness that set a new standard of automotive performance. This remarkable power plant features a higher compression ratio; a redesigned four-barrel carburetor; new, larger diameter combustion chambers; and a full 300 horsepower. Also available on the Eldorado models is an advanced engine utilizing two four-barrel carburetors and providing 325 horsepower. Both of these new Cadillac engines were deliberately designed and built to give the Cadillac owner a new dimension of driving ease and confidence.

Cadillac's completely new tubular-center X frame design for 1957 permits lowering both floor and car. The body is mounted on "outrigger" mounting brackets and actually gains in structural rigidity and resistance to twisting over the conventional type of frame.

Spherical joint suspension and an improved Cadillac Power Steering unit remove the last noticeable trace of handling effort. Maximum power assistance is obtained precisely when it is needed. All 1957 Cadillac models are factory-equipped with advanced Power Steering at no extra cost.



Veteran Cadillac owners will be amazed at the smoothness and eager responsiveness of the 1957 Cadillac controlled-coupling Hydra-Matic. Mechanical refinements have virtually eliminated noticeable shift points, yet retained all the efficiency and economy of the basic Hydra-Matic transmission design.



A vastly improved Cadillac Power Brake is standard, at no extra cost, on all 1957 models. Larger than last year, it noticeably reduces the amount of pedal effort required. And a new, wider brake pedal enables the driver to brake to a quick, safe stop with either his right or left foot with greater ease.



The Cadillac Air Conditioner for 1957 has been completely redesigned. Located completely forward of the passenger area, it circulates outside air that has been filtered of dust and pollen and has been cooled to the temperature the driver desires. It is available as an extra-cost item on all models.

PRE-SELECTOR RADIO—The Cadillac Pre-Selector Radio provides a fidelity and long-range reception that are unique in a motor car radio. Its automatic, precision tuning bar is a feature rare even in home radios. The antenna rises and lowers at the touch of a button and a foot control for changing the station is also available.

CADILLAC HEATING AND VENTI-LATING SYSTEM—All Cadillac models can be factory-equipped with a heating and ventilating unit of unusually high efficiency. Simple to operate, the Cadillac heater provides the desired warm air for front and rear compartments, as well as warm or cool streams to the windshield. "CUSHION TOPPERS"—To protect your car's upholstery, Cadillac makes available specially styled and colorblended "Cushion Toppers". They are made of beautiful, durable rayon-and-cotton twill and may be obtained in blue, green, gray, brown or black in the attractive and familiar "V" and Crest pattern.

FOG LAMPS—Cadillac Fog Lamps contribute greatly to safer driving in adverse weather. They are designed to throw a low, narrow vertical beam and a safe, broad horizontal area of light. When installed, they replace the standard parking light and directional signal assembly since they incorporate these functions.

LICENSE PLATE FRAMES—For 1957, Cadillac License Plate Frames are available in gold-colored anodized aluminum with a durable plastic window. They are styled to become an integral part of the car design, to eliminate sharp edges and to provide a final touch of elegance. They may be purchased singly or in sets of two. "AUTRONIC-EYE"—The Cadillac "Autronic-Eye" or Automatic Headlight Beam Control electronically dims your headlights as cars approach. The lights automatically return to high beam after cars pass and the road is clear. A foot switch is provided to signal drivers who forget or neglect to dim their lights.

E-Z-EYE GLASS—Your Cadillac may, if desired, be equipped with E-Z-Eye Glass—a subtly graduated gray tint that eliminates annoying road glare and filters out much of the sun's radiant heat. It does not interfere with vision in any way and may be ordered at nominal extra cost for all window areas in the 1957 Cadillac.

SEAT BELTS—Cadillac Seat Belts are made of attractive, extra-rugged nylon webbing. They are safe, sturdy and comfortable. The buckle is of the tested and proved airplane type design. Seat belts are available in a variety of matching colors for both front and rear seats—black, green, blue, gray, beige, red or white.

SPECIFICATIONS

ENGINE: Designed and precision-built by Cadillac. Eight-cylinder, overhead 90° V type; bore 4.0″; stroke 3.625″; displacement 365 cu. in. Engine mounted in rubber at three points. Compression ratio 10 to 1. Optional dual-carburetor engine available on Eldorado Biarritz and Seville only.

PISTONS: Aluminum alloy, slipper-type to reduce friction surfaces and permit nesting between crankshaft counterweights. Two compression rings, one oil ring with expander; top compression ring chrome-plated to minimize wear on cylinder walls; piston surfaces are stannate treated for better wearing qualities and scuff resistance.

CARBURETOR: Four-barrel downdraft with equalized manifolding; mechanical fuel pump; oil-bath type air cleaner; intake silencer; automatic choke. A special engine with dual, four-barrel carburetors is optional on the Eldorado Biarritz and Seville only.

LUBRICATION: Full-pressure. Oil filter standard. ELECTRICAL SYSTEM: 12-volt.

GASOLINE TANK CAPACITY: 20 gallons.

HYDRA-MATIC DRIVE: Fully automatic, stepgear type. Controlled fluid coupling on forward gear set for smoother shifts. Provides two Drive Ranges, Lo Range and Reverse.

REAR AXLE: Hypoid, semifloating. Differential housing offset to provide straight-line drive. Ratio is 3.07 on all except Series 75. A 3.36 axle is provided on Eldorados with the 325-h.p. engine, on Series 75, on air-conditioned models and optional on all other models. A 3.77 is optional on Series 75.

FRONT SUSPENSION: Spherical joint with Cadillac independent, helical-coil type springs.

REAR SUSPENSION: Hotchkiss drive. Rear springs are 5-leaf, semielliptic, $56\frac{1}{2}$ long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ wide (Series 75: 6-leaf).

BRAKES: Cadillac Power Brake System standard equipment. Low-pedal type with master brake cylinder mounted on the frame and the vacuum power cylinder mounted on the cowl. Effective brake lining area, 210.32 sq. in., 233.72 sq. in. on Series 75 models.

STEERING: Cadillac Power Steering standard equipment with an over-all steering ratio of 19.5 to 1.

FRAME: Cadillac tubular-center X frame provides increased rigidity while permitting lowering of body for improved appearance and greater stability.

TIRES: Low-pressure, 4-ply, tubeless. Size— 8.00×15 (Series 75: 6-ply, size— 8.20×15). White sidewall tires*, optional at extra cost.

DIRECTIONAL SIGNALS: Standard equipment.

BACK-UP LIGHTS: Standard equipment.

SABRE-SPOKE WHEELS*: Heavy-gauge steel and aluminum. Optional at extra cost.

TREAD: Front and rear, 61".

WHEELBASE: 60 Special, 133"; Series 62, 129.5"; Series 75, 149.75".

OVER-ALL LENGTH: 60 Special, 224.4"; Series 62 Coupe, Convertible and Coupe de Ville, 220.9"; Series 62 Sedan and Sedan de Ville, 215.9"; Eldorado Seville and Biarritz, 222.1"; Series 75, 236.2".
